Guide for children at object level:

Title Page: The child is given a barn with all of the animals placed around it.

Page 5: Child is shown the pig figure standing next to the barn.

Page 6: Child is shown a big and little horse.

Page 7: Child is shown the top of the barn.

Page 8: Weathervane is on top of barn.

Page 9: Child is shown a big and small pile of hay.

Page 10: Animals are shown.

Page 11: The child is shown the figures of the geese, donkey and goat.

Page 12: The child is shown a small scarecrow and a small hoe.

Page 13: The child is shown the rooster and the pigeon.

Page 14: The child is shown a hen and a small egg.

Page 15: The child is shown a big and small cow.

Page 16: The child is shown a black cat and a tiger patterned cat.

Page 17: The child is shown a red dog and puppies.

Page 18 and 19: The child is shown all the animals playing outside of the barn.

Page 20: The child is shown the cow and pig pretend to squeal.

Page 21: The child is shown the horse and donkey stomp in the hay around the barn.

Page 22 and 23: All animals go towards the barn, a black bat comes out of the barn.

Page 24 and 25: The child is shown all the animals in the barn and we pretend that they are sleeping.

Page 27 and 28: Child is shown the barn.

Page 29 and 30: Child is shown mice running outside the barn.

Page 31 and 32: Child is shown a moon going up over the barn.
