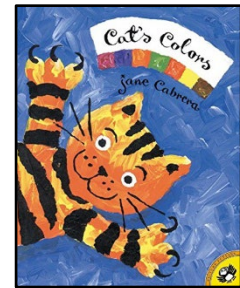





Book Title: Cat's Colors

Brief Plot Synopsis: Cat likes many colors, but he has one favorite color.



Object to Be Used	What part/page of the story does it apply to?	What are possible learning objectives?
<p>For each of the colored pages, use the following colors either on a light box OR various colored objects on a black contrasting background.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Green- Yellow- Pink- Black- Red- Yellow- Purple- Brown- Blue- White- Orange 	<p>For each corresponding page with a new color</p> 	<p><u>Motor:</u> Student can reach for/feel the colors.</p> <p><u>Academic/Communication:</u> Student can match colored objects to the correct colors on the lightbox/board. Student can identify either motorically or verbally what color they see.</p> <p><u>Visual:</u> Student can view the colors on the light box or contrasted background.</p>
 <p>Project Core Symbols: Same Different</p>	<p>On each page, provide two colored objects and give the reader the opportunity to indicate SAME or DIFFERENT.</p>	<p><u>Academic/Communication:</u> After viewing the two options of objects, students can select SAME or DIFFERENT.
