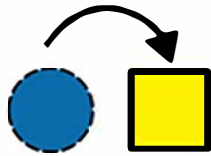

Acid Rain - pollution in rain that hurts animals and their homes



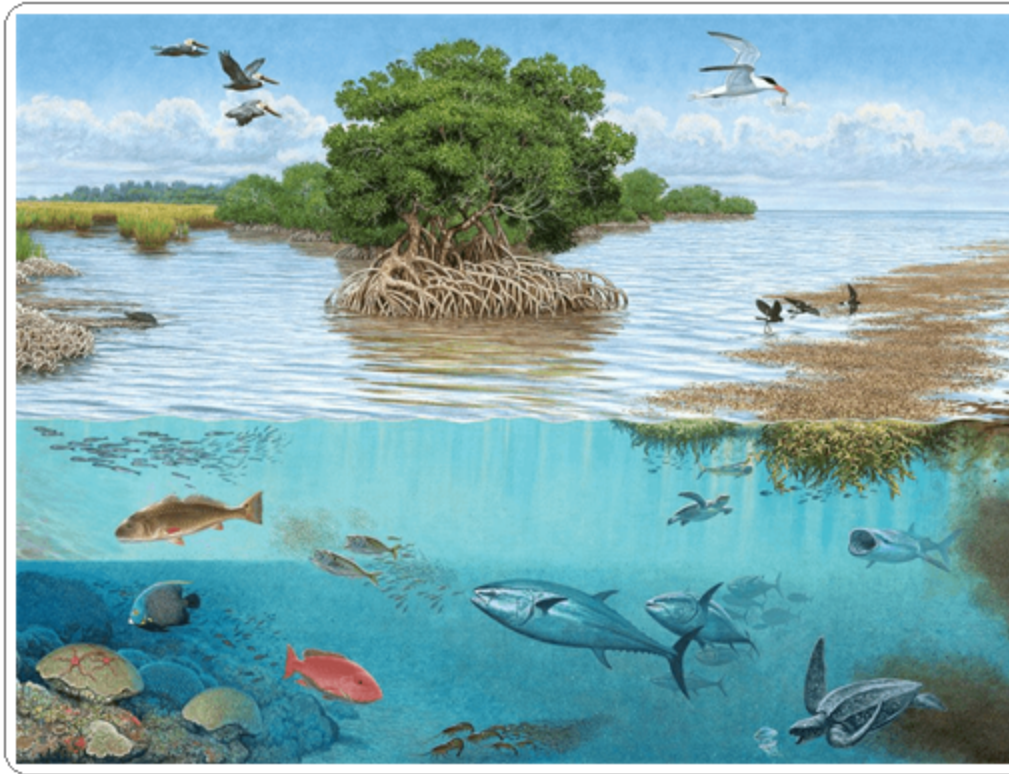
Endangered - Not many animals are left, almost extinct

Some animals change because of the environment.



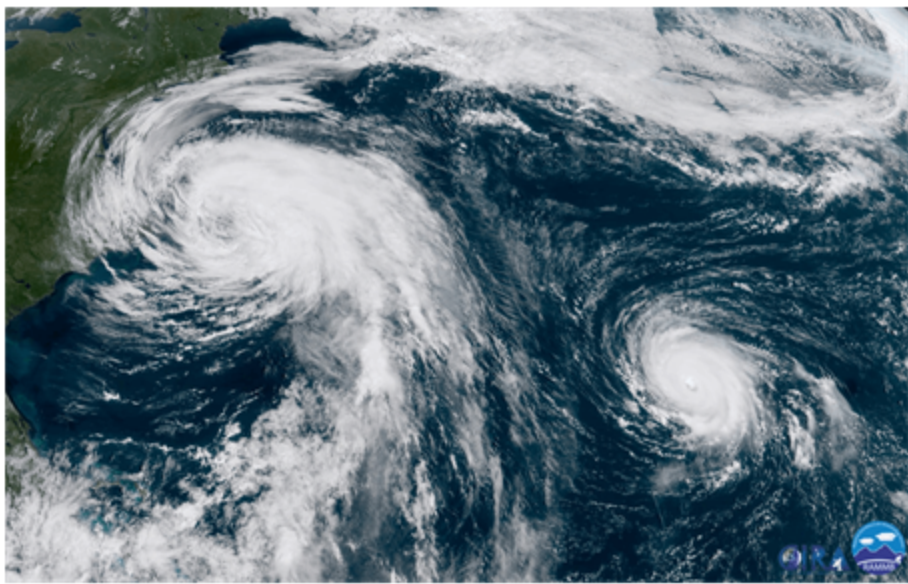
Ecosystems can change behaviors of animals.

Ecosystems change from humans.



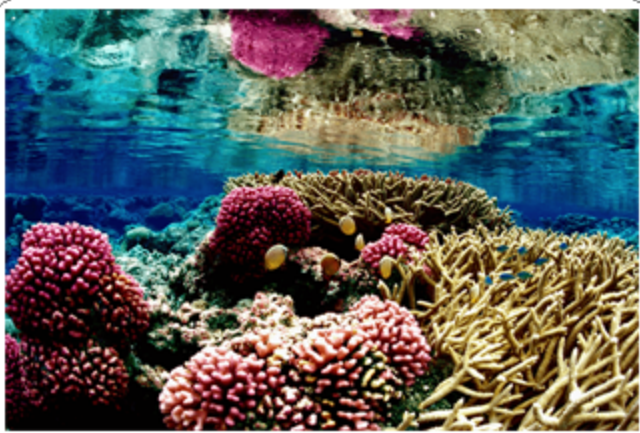
Habitats are homes for animals



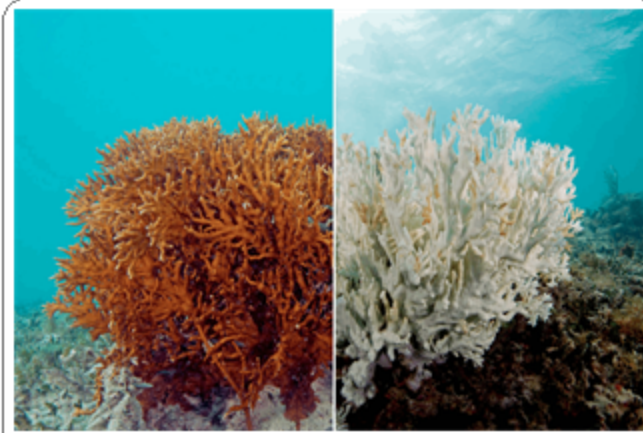
Cutting down trees destroys homes for animals.
