
Book Title: Community Soup

Brief Plot Synopsis: Kinoi tries to work in the community garden, but her goats have other

plans for the garden. Kinoi comes up with a plan to make things work!



Object to Be Used	What part/page of the story does it apply to?	What are possible learning objectives? Visual skills, auditory skills, motor skills, communication skills, academic skills
Spoon	When the broth is being mixed at the schoolhouse. When Kinoi tries the soup and it is delicious.	Motor: Student can reach for/feel the spoon. Student can bring the spoon to their mouth to imitate the action of eating. Communication: Allergies permitting, student can try soup broth and comment on whether or not they liked it.
Faux fur	When Kinoi finds her goats. When the goats eat the vegetables in the garden. When the goat follows Kinoi to school.	Motor/communication: Student can reach for/feel the faux fur, commenting on it's texture/color, etc. Academic: Student can identify what animal was in the story.
Project core symbol for Not	When Kinoi is mad at the goats for embarrassing her.	Motor: Student can feel the "not" symbol. Communication: Student can express "mad" with words, vocalizations, noises, or facial expressions.
Milk carton or cup	When Kinoi decides to milk the goat and put the milk in the soup.	Motor: Student can reach for/feel the milk carton. Auditory: Student can shake the carton and listen to the sound of the swishing milk. Communication: Allergies permitting, student can taste the milk and comment on whether they liked it.

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
