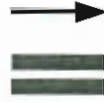


After lunch he will want to write a story.

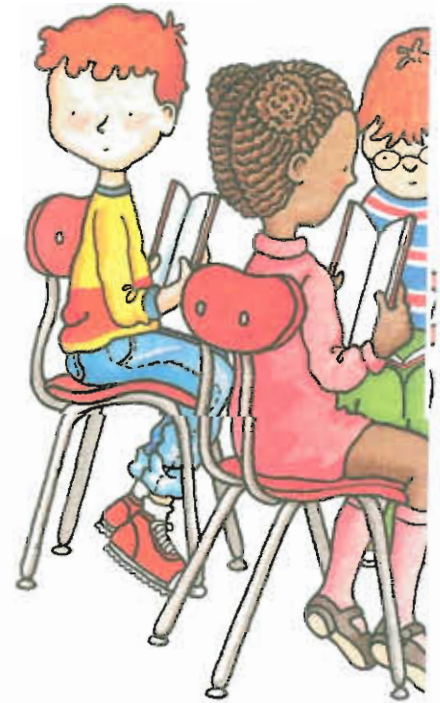

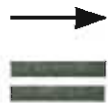

he will run to wait for the bus.



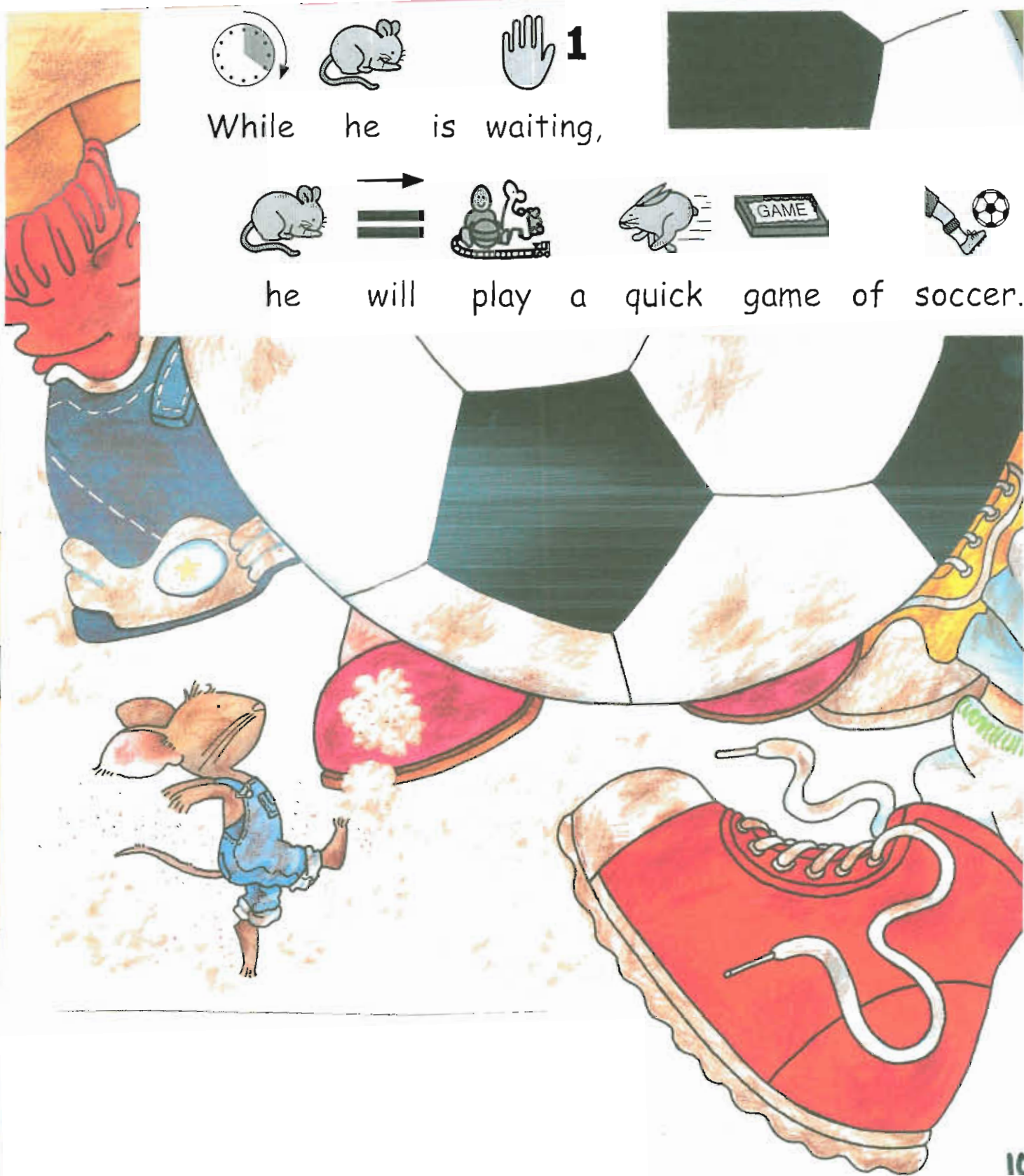

When he is all done with soccer,



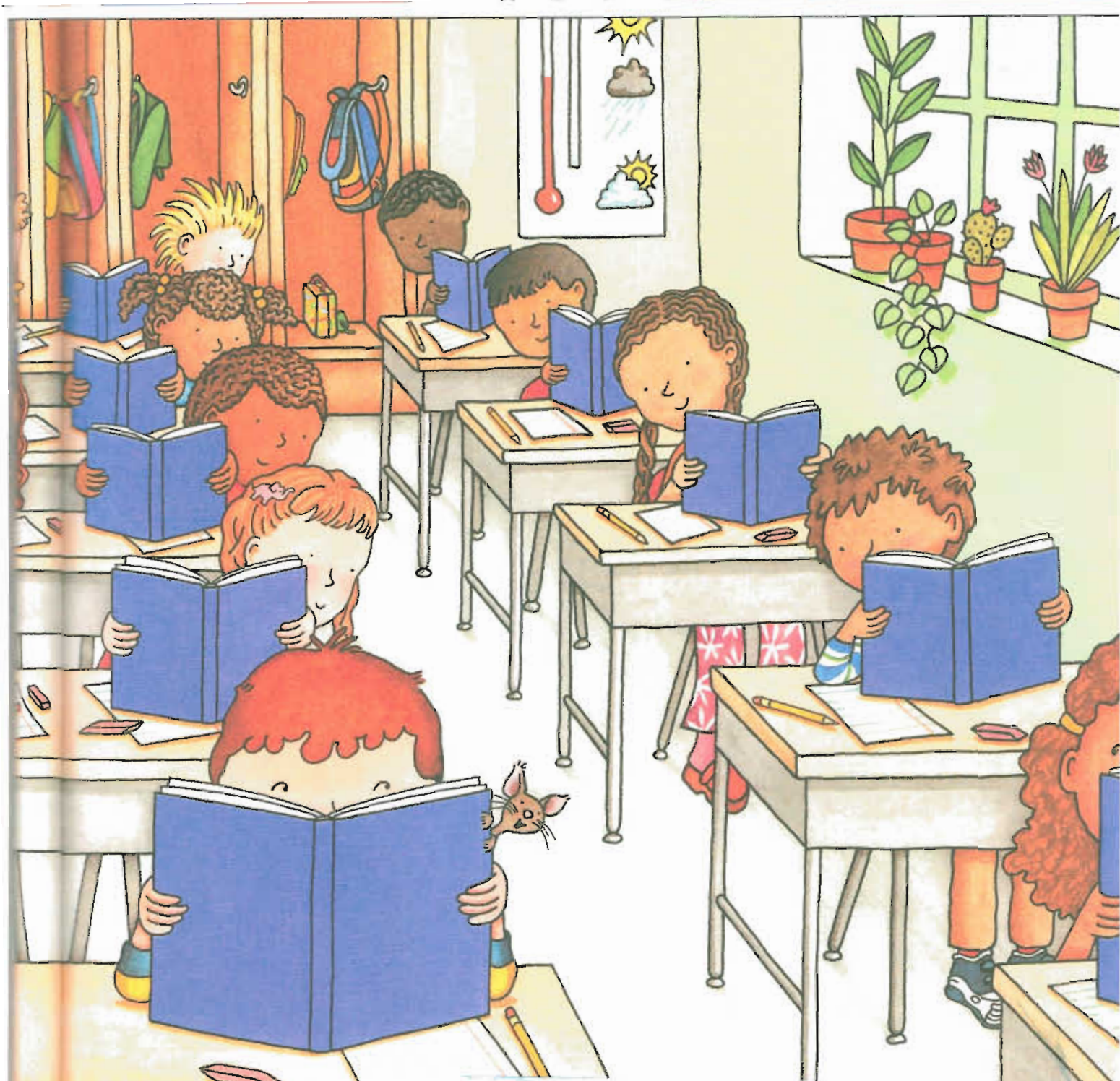
he will ask for a snack.
