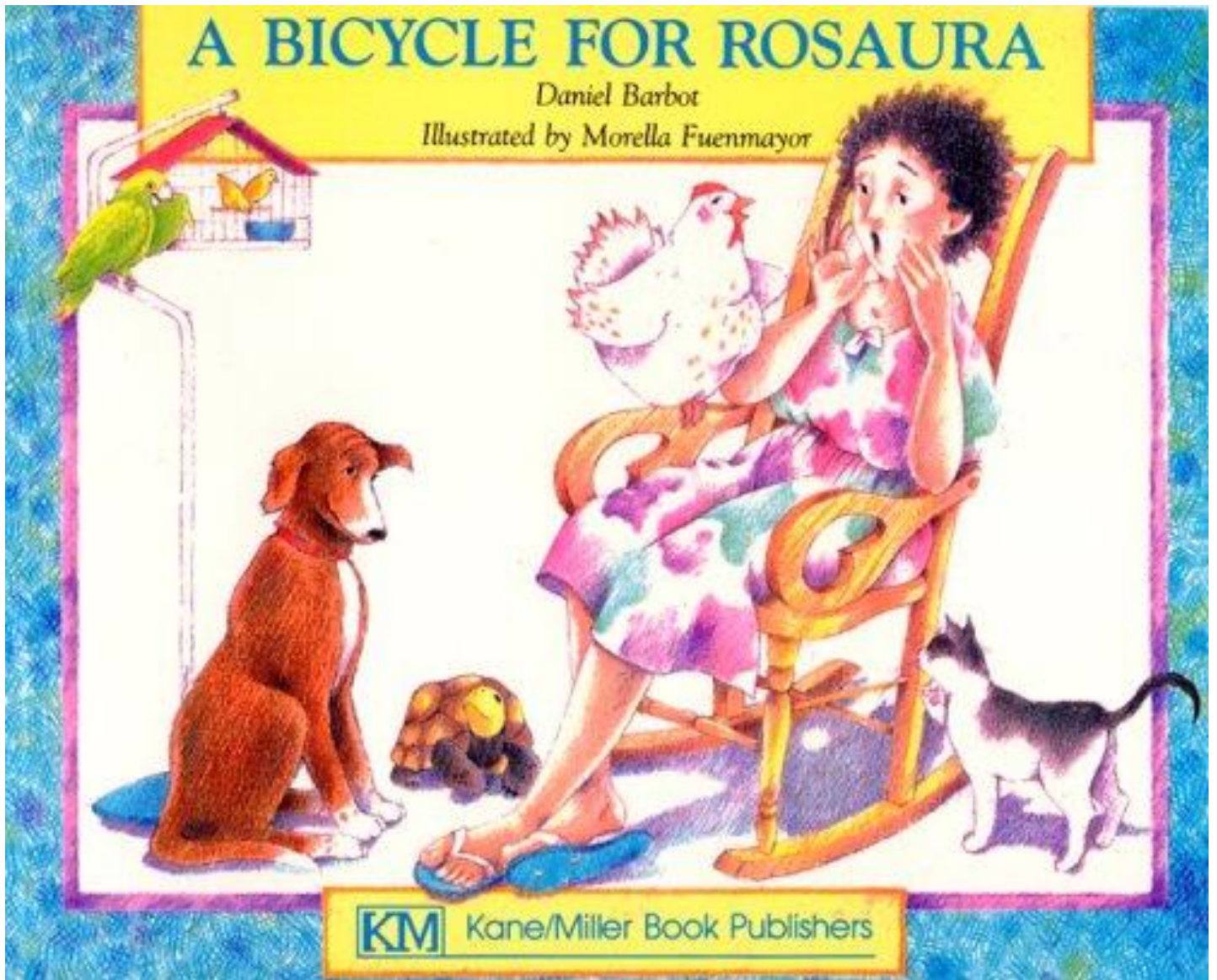

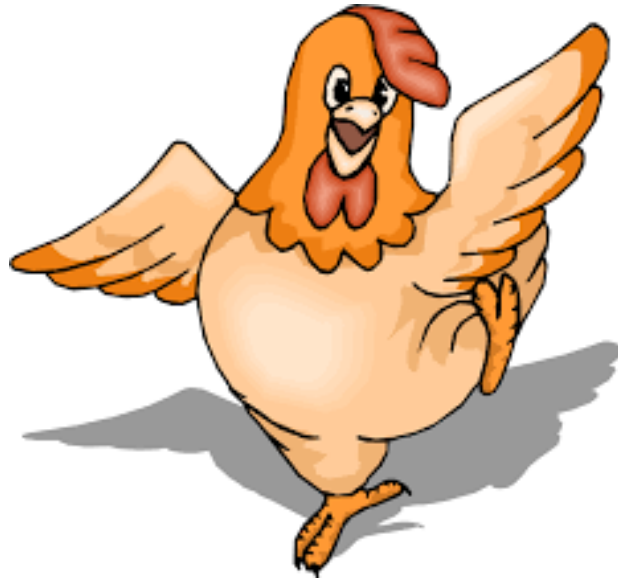

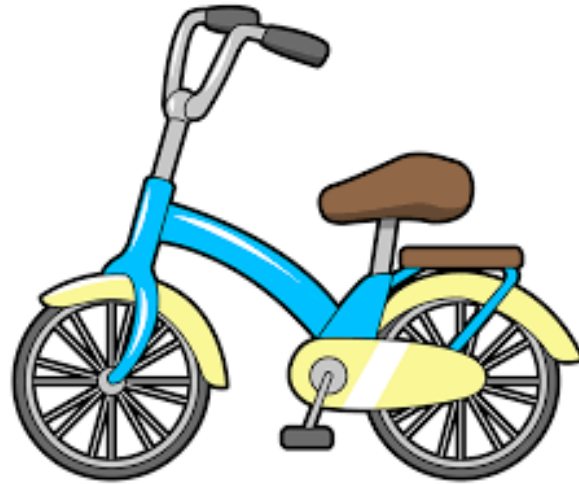
Amelia loves animals.

Amelia takes the bus to every bicycle shop.



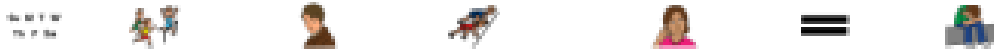
Everyone tells Amelia they don't make bicycles for a hen.

He is singing that he can make anything.









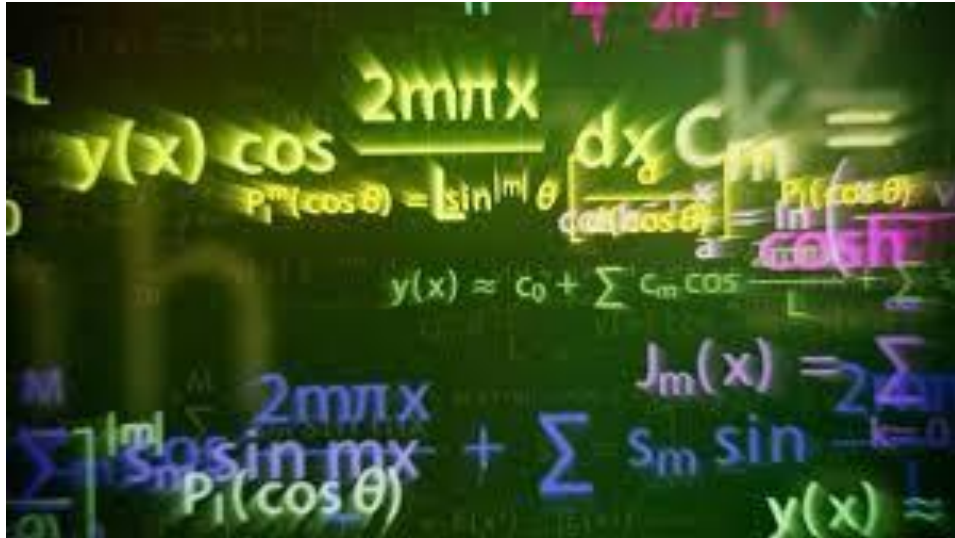
Even skates for a dog.
